***Madam President,***

1. Cambodia extends its heartfelt welcomes to the Delegation of the Republic of Indonesia led by **H.E. Mr. Edi Yusup**, Charge d'Affairs/Deputy Permanent Representative of the Permanent Mission of the republic of Indonesia to the United Nations at this 13<sup>th</sup> Session of the HRC for the adoption of the Universal Periodic Review Report of Indonesia. We wish to extend our sincerest congratulation to the Delegation for its successful conclusion of the 2<sup>nd</sup> UPR cycle at the WG of the HRC along with the presentation on the latest update on the new development on overall aspects in the field of Human Rights in the country since the review process.
2. As a fellow member of ASEAN, Cambodia is pleased with the significant progress and achievement made by Indonesia. We welcome the country adoption of most of the recommendations of the UPR process during this cycle.
